## Speech Instruction for Children Who Are D/HH

Monday, October 13

This introductory level workshop will provide knowledge for SLPs with limited experience evaluating, creating goals and planning speech therapy sessions for children who are d/hh. Presenters will provide a useful audiology overview as a basis for understanding the speech characteristics of children who are d/hh. They will also demonstrate specific techniques to help participants design practical therapy sessions for children at a variety of ages, birth–12+ years. Video, interactive activities, classroom observation and a CID tour will support lectures.

## Auditory Management and Instruction for Children Who Are D/HH: Using the CID SPICE Curriculum

Tuesday–Wednesday  
October 14–15

This intermediate level course is designed to teach SLPs and teachers techniques for capitalizing on the auditory information made available to a child with cochlear implants and/or hearing aids. Course features an overview of the original CID SPICE auditory learning curriculum, video, hands-on activities and classroom observation.

This course includes a review of technology, evolving cochlear implant candidacy guidelines, auditory milestones and speech perception, mapping, device troubleshooting, FM systems, a discussion with adult CI users and future directions. One SPICE kit per registrant will be available for \$300 (a \$75 discount).

## Real World Auditory Learning for Children Who Are D/HH: Using the CID SPICE for Life

Thursday, October 16

This intermediate level course is designed to teach audiologists, SLPs and teachers techniques to help children who are d/hh improve auditory memory, listening with technology, listening in noise, localization of sounds and more. The course features an overview of the CID SPICE for Life auditory learning curriculum with video and interactive activities. One SFL kit per registrant will be available for \$325 (a \$75 discount).

## Early Intervention for Children with Hearing Loss: A to Z

Tuesday, November 4

This introductory workshop is designed for early intervention providers, early childhood educators and SLPs helping children who are d/hh age birth to 3 to learn listening and spoken language.

Topics include accessing audiologic and family services; assessments for birth to 3; family support, counseling and weekly sessions; group instruction; characteristics of successful early interventionists; the transition process at age 3 and resources for professionals. Participants will have the opportunity to observe in the CID family center and pre-k classrooms. ## Early Intervention for Children with Hearing Loss: Case-Based Learning

Wednesday, November 5

This intermediate level, interactive seminar will explore problem-solving strategies for SLPs and other early intervention providers serving families of children who are d/hh. Case studies will be used to create dialog and develop strategies regarding coaching families, teaming with providers from other disciplines, current assistive technology, assessing communication development, etc.

Participants will learn to assess family needs so strategies can be developed to ensure positive outcomes, to identify challenges to family and caregiver buy-in, to use assessment tools specific to children who are d/hh, to troubleshoot assistive technology, and to identify public and private resources.

## Preschool Observation Workshop

Thursday, November 6

This workshop is designed to allow teachers, SLPs and administrators to observe in CID preschool classrooms for a school day. CID staff will be available during observation to discuss lesson objectives; techniques and strategies to teach listening, language and speech skills; techniques and strategies to weave listening, language and speech development throughout the day, and analysis of teacher behaviors and children's feedback. Attendees will have an opportunity to talk with CID preschool staff about a variety of topics, including scheduling, play-based learning, language curriculum components, early literacy instruction, speech and auditory development curricula, a whole child curriculum, the peer program, assessment, audiological management and parent involvement.

## Strategies for Teachers in the Mainstream

Working with Children Who Are D/HH

Friday, November 7

This introductory workshop is designed for general education teachers and staff with no previous training or experience teaching a student who is d/hh. Participants will learn effective teaching strategies for working with their students with hearing loss in the general education classroom. Topics covered include the impact of hearing loss on children, classroom acoustics, working with an IEP team, social skills and pragmatics. Participants are asked to view CID's free webinar, *Audiology 101: The Basics*, at [learn.cid.edu](http://learn.cid.edu) prior to the workshop. This course contains basic information about hearing loss and access to sound. Then bring your students' audiological information and audiograms and discuss them with a CID audiologist and workshop presenters.
