Degree (Master of Laws) from Howard University School of Law in Washington, D.C., where he graduated Cum Laude. He also holds an LP.D. Degree (Doctoral of Law and Policy) from Northeastern University in Boston, MA.

Dr. Sotonwa is a former Vice President of the National Black Deaf Advocates (NBDA). He also served as the Chair of the NBDA Board of Directors. Dr. Sotonwa is a member of the National Association of the Deaf (NAD), Hearing Loss Association of America (HLAA), Missouri Association of the Deaf (MoAD), as well as several think-tank organizations that focus on disability rights advocacy around the world.

Dr. Sotonwa holds two Missouri gubernatorial appointments as a member of the Missouri 911 Service Board and the Governor's Council on Disability. He is a member of the Relay Missouri Advisory Committee, Missouri Department of Mental Health Deaf Advisory Council, and Missouri Deaf-Blind Technical Assistance Project Advisory Committee. A consummate advocate; Dr. Sotonwa brings a lot of passion and a constituent-centered leadership approach to the Commission. A recipient of numerous awards, he lives in Jefferson City with his sons Bolu and Lekan.

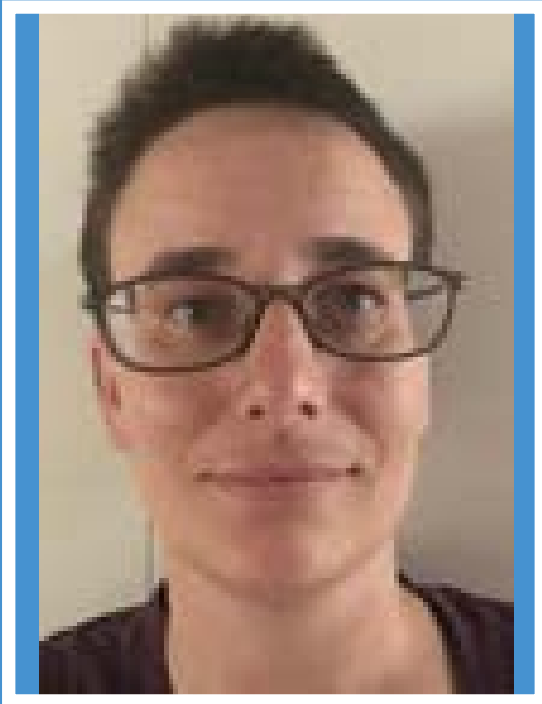
