From The Executive Director

DEI at MCDHH Update: MCDHH is working towards improving practices and awareness as well as working towards resolution of concerns recently discussed. We are beginning our work with a consultant as well as looking into further training on the issue and partnering with other agencies in our community to do that. While MCDHH has already begun at changing how we handle advocacy calls: addressing, follow-up, and documentation. This more-recent discussion had led to considering a similar practice for concerns or feedback the community would like to share or pursue with our office. We appreciate our community and input we have received and will put it to good use.

LEAD-K Progress: The LEAD-K Committee is having it's third meeting today. The Office of Childhood did a very good job gathering information from states who already have LEAD-K legislation or good programs for family services and language support and assessment. The committee looked through the information and provided feedback for which programs the committee felt best reflected our state. We are now looking closer at the programs in Kansas and Indiana and will reference these programs. The next step would be looking at assessments to recommend to the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education along with the milestones.

In honor of Black History Month, Sonya Smith has interviewed several Missourians as a part of her Spotlight series. TiaJenice Morris, one of our Commissioners who also owns her own business in the St. Louis area, and John Brand III, an assistant professor at William Woods University, were released earlier this month. Watch for our next spotlight coming soon!

MCDHH would like to send out a HAPPY ANNIVERSARY to the SASI of St. Louis. This is Sight and Sound Impaired-St. Louis. They host many activities and support programs

Deaf-Blind Task Force: MCDHH received interest for this Task-Force to be reinstated as an advisory group to the Commission as we work towards improving our service to the Deaf-Blind community. One very important part of this service is the SSP program. We are just getting things started and still getting grounded and figuring things out. We had our first meeting at the end of December and our second one will be next week, February 23rd. We will be establishing a way for consumers to provide input either to the Commission or through the representatives on the committee. More information will come.

Legislation to Keep an Eye On: This legislative Session there are two bills, HB 1918 and HB2626 being referred to the Health Care Reform committee (https://house.mo.gov/Committees.aspx?cluster=true) adding hearing aids and cochlear implants to be covered by MO HealthNet. Amusing Trivia

Football playoffs are in full swing, and this season brought an unexpected twist as dedicated fans cleared a whopping 19 inches of snow from Highmark Stadium for the Bills and Steelers game. The people don't realize there is a little piece of deaf history in football history. It is often a shared fact in the deaf community that Paul Hubbard

invented the football huddle in 1894.



Fast forward to 2023, when we once again made history with the introduction of the first-ever 5G-connected football helmet. AT&T, the Telecommunications giant, asked athletic director Warren Keller and head football coach Chuck Goldstein what they could do to make football more inclusive for the deaf.

The result? A cutting-edge helmet featuring a heads-up display connected to 5G. Imagine a coach sending plays directly from a tablet to the quarterback, who then relays the play to the team. This innovation not only aids hard of hearing and deaf players but also addresses challenges related to crowd noise that can affect communication on the field.

The Gallaudet football used it for the first time on October 5 played against Hilbert College. The results showed improvement in communication and reduced mistakes and penalties. Gallaudet's Bison football won the game 34-20! As for now, only quarterbacks will wear them, but the future looks promising. They are optimistic that the innovation will continue to further improve and become mainstream in sports one day.

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

Mental Health Services for the Deaf

There are mental services available for the D/HOH community in both St. Louis and Kansas City!

As we move into the winter season with shorter days, longer nights, and many holidays, it is important to talk about Seasonal Depression. Many people go through times when they feel unusually sad or just different, for some, these feelings happen when the seasons change, and have the "winter blues" when the daylight gets shorter in the fall/winter and start to feel better after daylight savings in the spring when the sun is out for longer.

Sometimes these mood changes can be more serious and can affect how a person feels, thinks, and even behaves. If you have noticed significant changes in your mood, thoughts, or behaviors during the fall/winter time, you may be struggling with Seasonal Affect Disorder or Seasonal Depression. Symptoms can include, among other things: Persistent sad, anxious, or "empty" mood, feeling hopeless, guilt, or unusually irritable. Oversleeping, over eating, and avoiding social situations can all be signs as well.

The holidays can also bring about struggles with loneliness, additional stress and anxiety, and the 'Holiday Blues". The good news is, treatment is available. Treatments for the "holiday blues" and for season depression can include talk therapy and medication services.

Program of Study Opportunities

This program is for interpreters who wish to improve their skills in working with a wider variety of populations and across a wider range of language variation. Interpreters participate in online modules and an induction program over 12 months. Thirty interpreters participate as a cohort and work through the Program of Study together. The cohort includes 20 trainees and 10 supervising partners from across the U.S.


We will also be playing Heads or Tails AND Before or After.
